12-Week Intensive English Program (ELPI)

Offered 3 times per year (September, January, April) for students:

- at upper beginner to university entrance levels (6 levels)
- who wish to improve their communication skills for professional or personal development
- who wish to prepare for university admission

PROGRAM FEATURES

30 hours per week:

- 18 hours—Core Classes
- 4 hours—Elective Classes
- 8 hours—Study Centre and Pronunciation Centre (optional)

6 Core Class Levels (students are placed in class levels based on the results of their placement test at the ELC):

- Upper Beginner (Level 200)
- Lower Intermediate (330)
- Intermediate (410)
- Upper Intermediate (490)
- Advanced (570)
- General Advanced Program (GAP) or University Admission Preparation (UAP).

Elective Class Examples (4 hrs/week):

• Business English, IELTS, TOEIC, Pronunciation, Listening, Idioms, Discussion Skills, Writing, Music, Art

Study Centre and Pronunciation Centre (8 hrs/week):

• Practise with teachers and volunteers in a relaxed setting

Social and Cultural Activities:

- · Coffee socials, sports, movies, festivals, volunteering
- Optional activities include: Butchart Gardens, theatre, ski trips, Vancouver trips, kayaking, whale watching (additional fees apply)

Students placed in intermediate class level 410 and above may choose general or academic English classes.

ACCOMMODATION:

Homestay is available for all 12-week programs.

ELPI students in 490 and above can take **English Plus Credit**, which allows students to take a credit course while studying in ELPI! Learn more on page 12.

GENERAL AND ACADEMIC OPTIONS

General Advanced Program (GAP)

- —highest general class level
- · Strengthens English for international communication
- Focuses on career, business, global issues and personal interests
- · Includes weekly volunteer work in the community

University Admission Preparation (UAP) —highest academic class level



- · Prepares students to study in an English-speaking university
- Strengthens skills in oral presentations, note taking, reading academic texts, report writing, research and computer use
- Students must successfully complete the UAP entrance exam and interview for acceptance; those not accepted will be placed in the appropriate level
- Passing score (80%) meets the English requirement for admission to degree programs at UVic



Successful completion of the UAP level of the 12-week program fulfills the English requirement for entrance to UVic undergraduate degree programs.

ADMISSION TO UVIC UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMS

 Students who meet all other academic requirements for admission to UVic undergraduate degree programs may be granted Preliminary or Conditional Admission when they are admitted to the 410 to UAP academic levels of the 12week program.

Preliminary Admission is given to:

- Students in ELPI 410, 490 or 570.
- Students with 71 iBT TOEFL or IELTS 5.5 Students have one year to meet UVic's English requirements.

Conditional Admission is given to:


- Students in UAP
- Students with 79 iBT TOEFL or IELTS 6.0

Students with Conditional Admission may register in UVic credit programs but cannot begin credit courses until they have met UVic's English requirement.

Summer Academic Intensive Program (ELAI)



A 9-week summer program for upper intermediate to advanced students wishing to focus on academic studies.

PROGRAM FEATURES:

- a summer "academic bridge" between the spring and fall ELPI programs
- 22.5 class hours per week
- 3 levels of instruction: Intermediate, Upper Intermediate and
- Classes held Monday to Thursday: 1:00 5:15 pm and Fridays: 8:30 am – 12:45 pm
- Evenings: Students living in the dormitories can join organized activities
- Weekends: optional activities

REQUIREMENTS

Minimum intermediate English level (410A)

Accommodation: Dormitory until closure in late August. Students continuing to September ELPI may move in with their host families early.

Canadian Experience Internship Program (paid internship)



This **one-year program** combines intensive classroom study at the advanced level with paid work experience in Victoria.

PROGRAM FEATURES:

- 24 weeks of intensive English classes
- 24-week paid internship in Victoria
- Job-preparation workshops
- · Letters of Recommendation
- Canadian Work Culture Workshop
- · Certificate of Participation
- Homestay or Dormitory accommodation

REOUIREMENTS

- Upper intermediate level (490) of the 24-week program or with approval of the ELC
- · A valid Study Permit

English Work Experience Program (EWEP)



This **20-week program** improves and challenges English skills by combining intensive classes with a full-time unpaid work term. Participants in this program will:

- Attend full-time English classes for 12 weeks
- Work in Victoria for 8 weeks

BENEFITS:

- Learn and improve your "real English" outside of the classroom
- Add international work experience to your résumé in fields such as tourism, customer service and office administration
- Canadian Work Culture Workshop
- Certificate of Participation from the University of Victoria
- Letters of Recommendation

REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum upper intermediate level of English
- Intermediate level of English (410) of the 12-week program or with approval of the ELC
- · A valid Study Permit



Monthly Language and Culture Programs (3–6 weeks)

Offered throughout the year for students:

- at pre-intermediate, intermediate or advanced levels
- who wish to improve their speaking and listening skills
- who want to learn about Canadian culture through intensive English classes and social and cultural activities

PROGRAM FEATURES:

- Monthly start dates
- Focus on speaking and listening skills
- 20 hours of class time per week
- Daily social and cultural activities for May–August programs; weekly social and cultural activities for September–April programs. These activities are included in the program cost and guided by ELC Cultural Assistants

University Admission Preparation (UAP)

ADVANCED ENGLISH AND CANADIAN STUDIES

- 4-week full-time program
- · Morning courses:
 - Advanced English Language Skills
 - An Introduction to Canadian Culture (CS 101)
- Afternoon academic skills workshops
- Entrance requirement: IELTS 6.0 with no section less than 5.5 or 79 iBT

Successful completion of this program fulfills the English language requirement for entrance to UVic undergraduate degree programs. Students must:

- Receive a passing grade (80%) for Advanced English.
- Receive a minimum C in Canadian Studies; students may take this course for 1.5 credit units for an additional fee.



Students who meet the academic requirements for admission to UVic undergraduate degree programs may be granted **conditional acceptance** upon admission to this summer UAP program or the 12-week UAP level.

Customized Group Programs

The ELC offers customized short-term programs which can be designed to suit the schedule and interests of a group of students. These programs can combine classroom instruction with other activities, such as cultural excursions or volunteering placements. Programs can also include English for Special Purposes, such as **Business English** and **English for Teachers**. Homestay or dormitory accommodation is available, depending on the time of year.



- Entrance requirement: TOEIC 600, 71 iBT or IELTS 5.0

UVic Dormitories

Live on campus in the university dormitories with other international students and ELC Cultural Assistants.

The dormitory program includes:

- a single room with a bed, desk, dresser, mirror and linens
- a cafeteria meal plan (2–3 meals per day)
- support of ELC Cultural Assistants living in the dormitories
- · additional evening and weekend activities

Dormitory accommodation is <u>only</u> available in July and August. Full fees are due 5 weeks before the program start date.

Immigration and Medical Information

CANADIAN IMMIGRATION LAWS

After completing the Program Application Form and paying the application fees, students receive a **Letter of Acceptance** from UVic to take to the nearest Canadian Embassy/Consulate.

It is the **student's responsibility** to obtain the correct visa or permit.

TEMPORARY RESIDENT VISA (TRV) – FORMERLY 'VISITOR VISA'

Students from many countries can study English in Canada for a maximum of 6 months as a visitor. A Temporary Resident Visa cannot be renewed in Canada to continue studies.

STUDY PERMIT

Students must have a Study Permit to study in Canada for more than 6 months. Students must apply for a Study Permit in their home country. Study Permits can be renewed in Canada.

MEDICAL INSURANCE

All English Language Centre students must have medical insurance and should confirm that it covers any activities they may participate in (including sports).

Length of stay in Canada	Type of insurance needed
0–6 months	Buy private medical insurance before leaving your home country from AON Medical Insurance Company (\$1.60/day; not valid until purchased).

- buy medical insurance for the duration of the program
- have a basic knowledge of English and successfully complete the online test:
