WILL is used:

- -For offers:
- . I'll help you with everything. I'll bring the sodas.
- -For promises
- I'll be there for you, I promise.
- I'll pass the final exam with top grade.



- -For requests:
- Will you do me a favor?
- •Will you give me a ride home, please?
- -For on-the-spot decisions:
- Ok, I'll meet you in an hour.
- Oh, don't worry, I'll answer the phone.

- -For predictions, usually with the verbs think and believe:
- I think she will be a great actress one day.

He believes I will fail the exam.



Affirmative form:

Subject + will +verb +complement

I will study for the exam.

Mary will graduate in July.

My friends will play soccer tomorrow.



- Negative form:
- Subject + will not +verb +complement
- I will not go out tonight.
- She will not date him.
- They will not be in the same class again.



- Interrogative Form:
- will+ subject + verb + complement +?
- Will I wash all those dishes?
- Will Pedro check his email?
- Will your classmates come to class?

Interrogative Form:

- Recuerda que se debe responder con **short answers** utilizando el verbo auxiliar (WILL).
- Will I wash all those dishes?
- Yes, you will.
- No, you will not.
- Will Pedro check his email?
- · Yes, he will.
- No, he will not.
- Will your classmates come to class today?
- Yes, they will.
- No, they will not.

- Contractions:
- Subject + will =

I'll, he'll, she'll, it'll, we'll, you'll, they'll

subject+will not + verb =

I, you, he, she, it, we, you they + won't + verb
