Temporalities and Spatialities in Hegel's Philosophy

November 4-6, 2026

Xalapa, Veracruz, Mexico

In collaboration with the Veracruzana University and the group La Razón en la Historia, the Ibero-American Society of Hegelian Studies (SEH) is organizing the *3rd International Congress of SEH*, titled "Temporality and Spatiality in Hegel's Philosophy," which will take place from November 4 to 6, 2026, in Xalapa, Veracruz.

The aim of this meeting is to promote rigorous and critical analysis of the notions of space and time in Hegelian philosophy, as well as to encourage their projection and interpretation in contemporary debates. Hegel approaches space and time not only as determinations of nature, but also as fundamental elements in logic, as keys to understanding the moments and forms of the spirit, and, of course, they are present in

the structure of history itself. Against this backdrop, this congress aims to foster a philosophical dialogue that includes critique and explores these key dimensions, emphasizing their importance within the Hegelian system and their potential to reshape contemporary debates.

- Comparisons with Kant, Schelling, Fichte, and Other Modern Thinkers
- Post-Hegelian Appropriations of Space and Time (Marx, Derrida, Deleuze, etc.)
- Geography and Geology in the Philosophy of Nature
- Opposition and/or Connection between 'World' and 'Earth'
- Spatial and/or Temporal Metaphors Throughout the System
- Earth, Nature, and Property in Young Hegel

If a research group wants to propose a specific roundtable or showcase their collective work, they should submit a proposal outlining the focus of their project.

The conference's academic committee will review the abstracts, and acceptance notifications will be sent by **April 30, 2026**.

Accepted papers must be no longer than 30 minutes.
